### Management Upper Division Admission Requirements

Courses in bold type and outlined can be taken only after a student is admitted to Upper Division Management. Each semester, the record of students who have completed all courses in the Management Admissions Index (\*MAI), have at least a 3.00 MAI and 2.50 GPA, have a "C" or higher in all MAI and School of Management courses, and are not on probation will be automatically admitted to Upper Division Management. Students with at least a 2.75 MAI who do not meet all of the additional requirements listed above will be reviewed by the Faculty Undergraduate Admissions Committee to determine whether space is available and sufficient cause exists to be admitted to Upper Division Management.

**NOTES**

- A.** The Management Admissions Index (MAI) is a weighted average (the weights being the semester credits assigned to each course) of the grades earned in the following courses: MA 15900 (or MA 15300 & MA 15400); 22300 & 22400, or equivalent; MGMT 20000; CS 23500; ECON 25100; ENGL 10600 or equivalent; and COM 11400. These courses are indicated by the notation \*MAI. Previous enrollments in MA 16100,16200,16500,16600 do not count against the retake policy if a Change Of Degree Objective occurs.
- B.** **General education elective** courses in natural science, sociology/psychology, world history, fine arts, literature, and international issues must be selected from approved lists maintained by the Management Advising Office and listed below. Contact your advisor with alternate courses that meet these criteria.
- C.** **Professional elective courses consist of MGMT, ECON, or OBHR 30000 level or higher, and are listed below. ECON 51100, 51200, 51300, 51400, 51500, OBHR 30000, MGMT 32300 and 45500 are no credit.**
- D.** An elective consists of three hours of approved course credit or combination of 1 and 2 credit hour courses = 3 hours.

**Optional Concentrations:**

The following concentrations are available, but not required, for management majors: Accounting, Analytical Consulting, Economics, Finance, International Business, Management Information Systems, Marketing, Organizational Behavior/Human Resources, Operations Management, and Strategic Management.
